Three tips to provide a good in-barn verification experience.

- 1** This is the learner's first opportunity to teach the information back to you. Let them know that you are the student to teach you what they learned in the lesson as if you are a new employee.
- 2** Watch for variation in SOPs and take the time to proactively correct while complimenting them on what they have learned and what they do well when they demonstrate the task for you.
- 3** Make sure they know that a part of being verified means that the company is asking them to be a mentor for this task. They will be teaching by their actions every day. Ask them to own it and live it as a part of being verified.

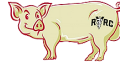
